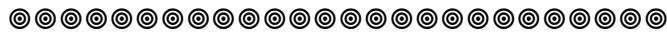

This Privacy Policy

This Privacy Policy is applicable to any personal information ("User Information"), which is supplied by you, the website user, to us, Groovy Art Workshops and our sponsors and partners through the Groovy Art Workshops website ("this Site") and our other partner websites. This Policy is devised to help you feel more confident about the privacy and security of your personal details.

We understand that your privacy and the protection of your personal information is important to you. We take your privacy seriously and take every reasonable precaution to safeguard the personal information you supply to us.

About Groovy Art Workshops

'Groovy Art Workshops' is an educational and events supplier of activities to children and young adults. We are a UK based organisation.

Please note that we, Groovy Art Workshops, power the competition.

We wish to offer the users of our website the opportunity to participate in surveys, offers, competitions and questionnaires (all of which we refer to as 'surveys' in this policy). Please note we may also retain your data and you may be offered the opportunity to opt-in to our marketing and promotional services.

You may be registered with Groovy Art Workshops Competitions and as such you may receive separate future promotions, emails and offers from Groovy Art Workshops Competitions. You may unsubscribe from Groovy Art Workshops at any time.

The Data We Collect from You

We collect the following data from you:

Registration/Entry and Profile Data: When you register/subscribe/enter onto our mailing list, promotional activities, and/or competitions with us we will take information from you including your name, address, email address and telephone number.

Survey/Questionnaire Responses: When you complete a survey or questionnaire the information you provide will also be collected by us for our marketing, quality control and customer service purposes.

Cookies Data – please see below.

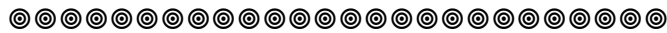
The data will be held by us subject to this policy. The partner website through which you may have registered may also retain your Registration and Profile data subject to the terms of their own policy.

How We Use Your Data

The information with which you provide to us will only be used by us.

The information will be used for analytical and marketing purposes.

All data supplied by you may be used by us for general administrative processing purposes.

Your data together with that of other subscribers to our service may also be combined in order of us to build statistical and analytical tables. At no time will your data be individually identifiable in such tables.

Transfer of your Data to Third Parties

The information you provide to us will not be transferred to countries outside of the European Union ("EU"). If we transfer your information outside of the EU, we will take steps with the aim of ensuring that your privacy rights continue to be protected as outlined in this privacy policy.

If you use our services while you are outside the EU, your information may be transferred outside the EU in order to provide you with those services.

We may transfer your personal information to a third party as part of a sale of some or all of our business and assets to any third party or as part of any business restructuring or reorganisation, but we will take steps with the aim of ensuring that your privacy rights continue to be protected.

Participation in Competitions, Questionnaires and Offers

By participating in a competition/survey you are agreeing to allow us to transfer both your Registration and Profile Data and your Survey Responses to the sponsor of that survey where your data will be anonymised. By completing the competition/questionnaire/survey you are "opting-in" to the transfer of that data.

We are keen to ensure that the principals of "opting-in" are clearly explained. This means that when you participate in a competition/questionnaire/sponsor question, you understand that you may receive promotional offers from us or the sponsoring company based on the information you provide in that questionnaire and the initial registration page. You can de-register/unsubscribe at any time if you would prefer not to receive such promotions in the future.

Sponsors of the surveys may have their own privacy policies and opt-in statements, we strongly recommend that you read and understand this information.

Data Protection Rules and Regulations

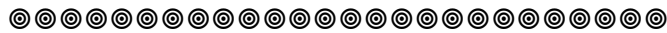
Your information will always be safeguarded under the terms and conditions of the Data Protection Act to ensure that the information you provide us with is safe and only used for the purposes you requested.

We will comply will all data protection legislation applicable to the UK.

We will not disclose your personal data to third parties without your permission to do so as set out above. When you enter into a sponsor's offer or competition you will be consenting to the disclosure of your personal information to that sponsor.

Unsubscribe

You can unsubscribe from the Groovy Art Workshops service at any time according to your requirements. The consequences of unsubscribing are that your account details will be placed in a suppression file and you will not receive any further email communications from the Groovy Art Workshops service.

At the bottom of every email that we send out you will be provided with clear information on how you can unsubscribe.

Security

We are committed to protecting the security of your personal information.

In instances where you must type the correct password to access your account information, it is your responsibility to ensure the security of your password is not revealed to others.

We use a variety of security technologies and procedures to protect the confidentiality, integrity and availability of Your User Information. For example, we store the personal information you provide on computer systems with limited access, which are located in controlled facilities.

Although we endeavour to ensure the security of all correspondence, the Internet is not a 100% secure medium. Therefore, we are unable to guarantee the security of any data you send electronically to us and therefore cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage experienced through any loss of confidentiality of information.

Cookies

You should be aware that by using the site, information and data may be automatically collected through the use of Cookies. Please note, Cookies do not attach to Your system or damage Your files.

"Cookies" are small text files that store basic information that a web site can use to recognise repeat site visits and, as an example, recall your name if this has been previously supplied. We may use this information in order to monitor and improve the Site and our services and to target surveys and advertising more effectively.

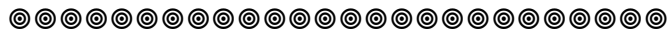
If you do not want information collected through the use of Cookies, there is a simple procedure in most browsers that allows you to deny or accept the Cookies feature. Note, however, that there may be some deterioration in the service you receive and "personalised" services may be affected if the Cookies option is disabled.

We also uses cookies to improve the login experience. For example, we may store your login details in a cookie that will remain on your computer after you log out. This cookie allows you to be automatically logged in the next time you visit the Site.
